

St. Therese of Lisieux "The little flower of Jesus" Feast Day, Saturday October 1


Saturday, Oct. 1st is the Feast of our beloved St. Therese. For the next couple of weeks, we will be having some reflections either written by St. Therese or someone close to her. There are many books on the life of St. Therese. There are three that I highly recommend. They are: The Story of a Soul, which is her autobiography. It is so beautifully written and really gives great insight into her faith and devotion. The second one is: St. Therese, The Little Flower, The Making of a Saint by John Beevers. And one that I am using for these meditations is Mornings with St. Therese compiled by Patricia Treece.

HOW SWEET IS THE WAY OF LOVE!

I wish for only one thing: to love Jesus even unto folly! Love alone attracts me. I no longer wish for either suffering or death and yet both are precious to me. For a long time I've hailed them as messengers of joy. I've already known suffering and I've thought I was approaching the eternal shore. From my earliest days, I have believed I'd be plucked in the springtime of life. But today my only guide is self-abandonment. I no longer know how to ask passionately for anything except that the will of God shall be perfectly accomplished in my soul. I can repeat the words of our Father, St. John of the Cross: "I drank deep within the hidden cellar of my Beloved and, when I came forth again, I remembered nothing of the flock I used to look after. I've finished all other work except that of love. In that is all my delight." How sweet is the way of love! O f course one may stumble and be guilty of small faults, but love, able to draw good from everything, will very quickly destroy all that displeases Jesus and will fill one's heart with a deep and humble peace.

ON PRAYING FOR OTHERS

I am especially united to the new brothers (Father Roullad and Belliere, young missionaries her prioress asked Therese to support with prayer) given me by Jesus. All I have belongs equally to each of them, for God is too good and generous to divide it. He is so rich that He gives me without limit what I ask, although I do not get involved in making up a long catalogue of my wants. As I have two brothers and the novices, the days would not be long enough for me to detail the needs of each soul, and in any case I should be terrified of forgetting something important. Complicated methods are no use to simple souls, and as I am one, Our Lord Himself has given me a very simple little means of fulfilling my obligations. After Holy Communion one day He made me understand the significance of these words: "Draw me: we will run after Thee to the odor of Thy ointments." So, Jesus, there is no need to say: In drawing me, draw the souls I love. When a soul has been captivated by God, she cannot run alone. Every soul she loves is drawn after her.

Statement of Cardinal Justin Rigali on the death of Queen Elizabeth II



I learned of Queen Elizabeth's death while en route back to the United States after concelebrating the beatification Mass for Pope John Paul I, and after meeting with Pope Francis. Queen Elizabeth was a remarkable woman and rightly admired for her calmness and wisdom. I ask that we remember the significance of her historic encounters with five different popes, including the first visit ever to England and Buckingham Palace by the leader of the Roman Catholic Church, Pope John Paul II, in 1982. The symbolic impact of this moment will long resonate in history. The Queen met with St. John Paul three times—including twice in Rome. I was honored to be present for one of those encounters. There is certainly something truly dignified about the British way of honoring their Queen. Let us continue to offer prayers for Her Majesty, her family, and her nation.
